Questions: first year application

Have you previously been awarded funding for Linnaeus-Palme planning?

1. Describe the project's purpose and objectives. Justify the project's relevance to the Linnaeus-Palme Programme and how it can contribute to strengthening the partnership and meeting the mutual need for development.

2. Describe the project's relevance to the implementation of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development. Motivate which of the 17 goals is/are most relevant. Provide concrete examples linked to the project's subject area.

3. Describe the main activities and how they contribute to the project's objectives. Provide example of content for the planned exchanges.

4a. If you are applying for funding for other activities in addition to project exchanges, please describe which activities you are planning and provide a detailed reasoning for how they relate to the project's objectives.

If you are not applying for funding for other activities in addition to exchanges, please write "not relevant".

4b. If you are applying for funding for other activities in addition to the exchanges, present your calculated costs for the activities described in the answer to question 4a. Where possible, please divide the costs into several budget items per activity.

5. Describe both parties' capacity and resources for undertaking a project with mutual exchanges. How will you ensure that the granted student/teacher exchanges take place? What preparations and what support can your higher education institutions offer participants during the exchange?

6. How will you communicate with all relevant students regarding information about exchange opportunities, including the potential to receive support for special needs? Also describe how you will ensure that the selection process is transparent and free of fraud at both parties?

7. Present a risk analysis in which you describe the risks you see, their potential consequences for the project and measures to counteract them. Describe internal and external risks. Analysing the risk of corruption is obligatory.

8. Describe how both parties will evaluate the project and how you will follow up the results of the evaluation. Give examples.

9a. Will any of the funding be transferred to the Palme university?

Questions: continuing application

Note: this is not applicable if you were previous granted funds within Linnaeus-Palme Planning.

Are you applying for continued collaboration within a partnership that has already been awarded a grant under the program LP-partnership?

1. Describe the results you have achieved in the project in previous years. Present what you have learned and the opportunities for improvement you can see. Reflect on the results in relation to the length of the partnership.

2. Describe the project’s relevance to the implementation of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development. Motivate which of the 17 goals is/are most relevant. Provide concrete examples linked to the project’s subject area.

3. Briefly describe the project’s objectives and justify any changes to the original project. Provide examples of content on the planned exchanges and how these activities contribute to the project’s objectives.
